



# BROWN - WORK HARD


**Read: Colossians 3:23**

**Pray:** Brown isn't always a flashy, pretty, or fun color, but it gets the job done. Sometimes doing your homework or studying for a test isn't flashy, fun, or pretty either, but God calls us to work hard at everything we do, as if we are doing the work for Him. So as you think about the school year ahead, ask God to help you work hard, do your best, and persevere when you feel like giving up. Ask God to help you work at school with all your heart so that you can honor Him this year through your actions and attitude.

**Read:** Acts 4:29-31

**Pray:** Orange is a bright, bold color, and it reminds us to be bold for Jesus! Sometimes we may feel silly talking to our friends about Jesus, or someone may even make fun of us for it. But the Bible tells us that the Holy Spirit gives us the power to be bold when we talk about God. Ask God to give you boldness to talk about Him at school this year. Ask God to remind you that the Holy Spirit is with you. Ask God for the courage to share about Jesus with your friends and teachers and for the boldness to invite your friends to church.
