

## God's Promise

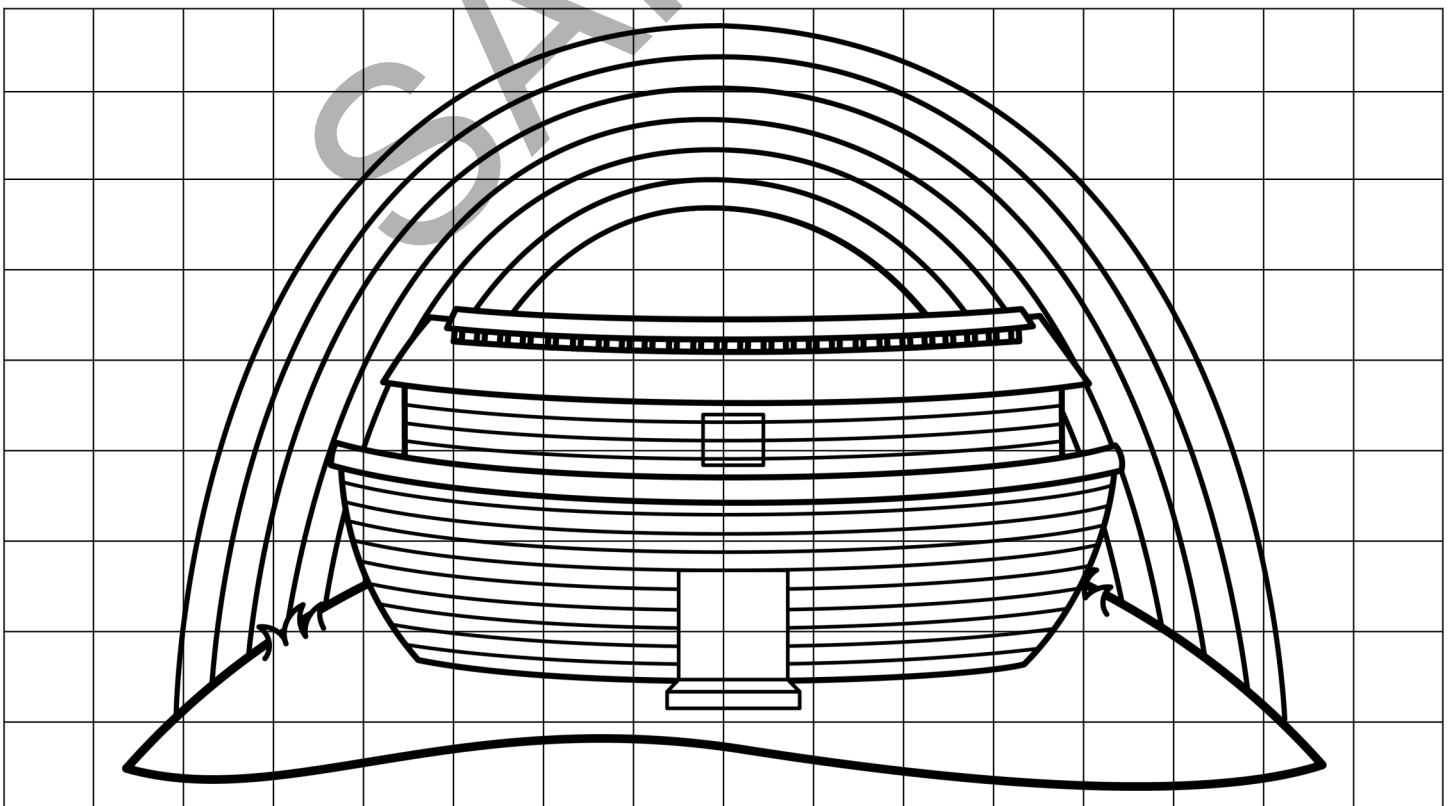

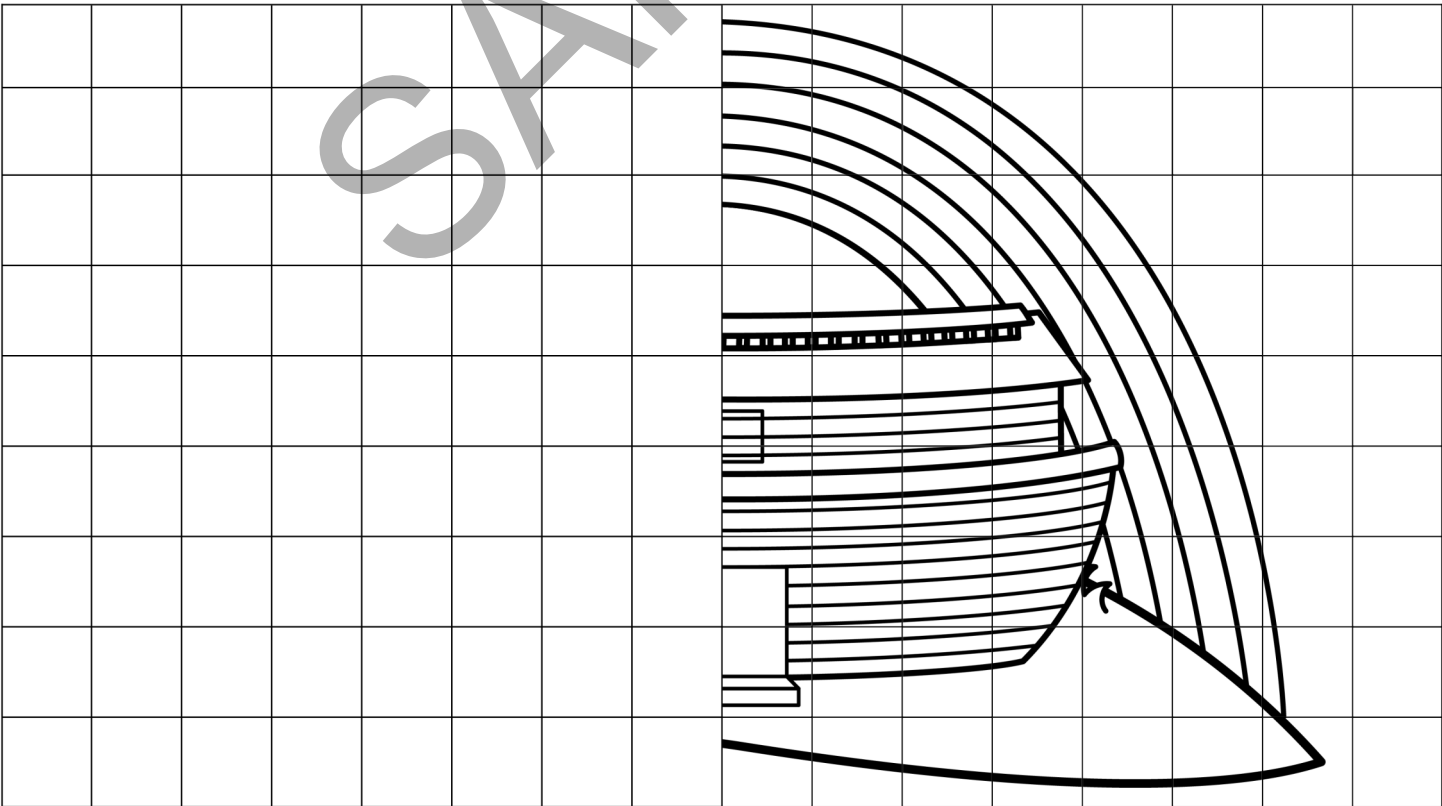
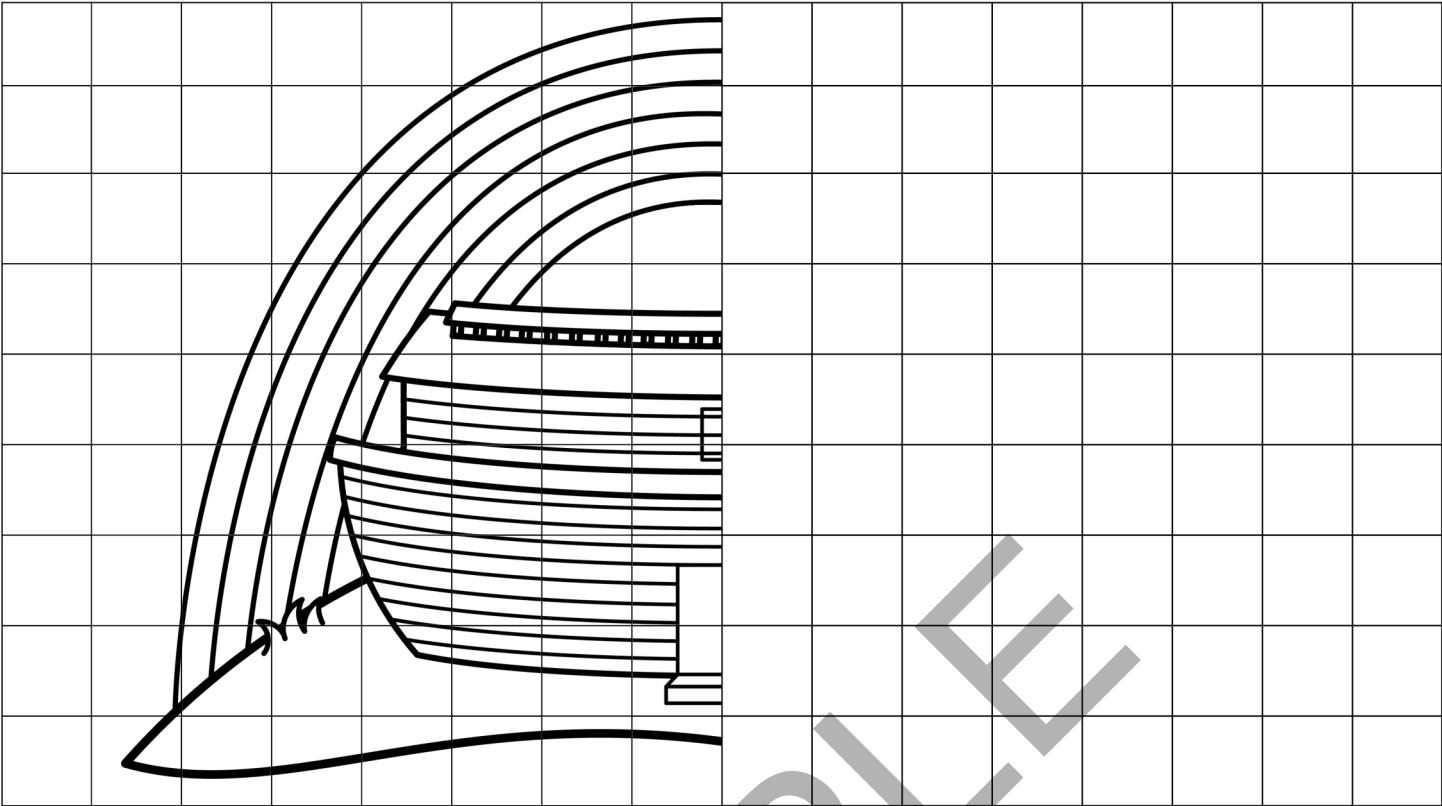

Follow these instructions to draw a picture representing God's promise like the one shown below:

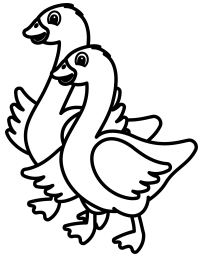

- Now, using a blank grid, try drawing the whole picture.



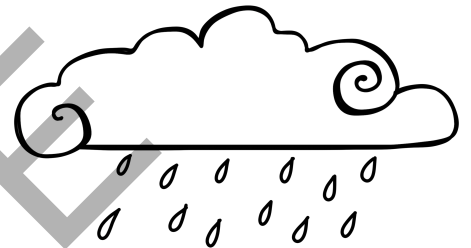
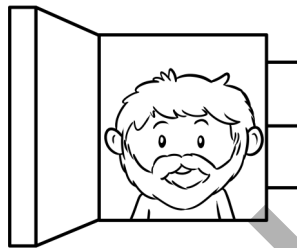
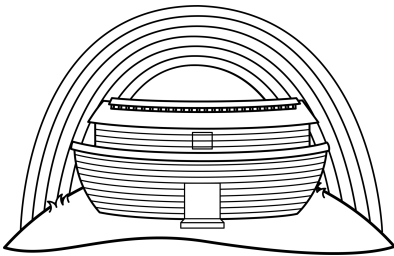

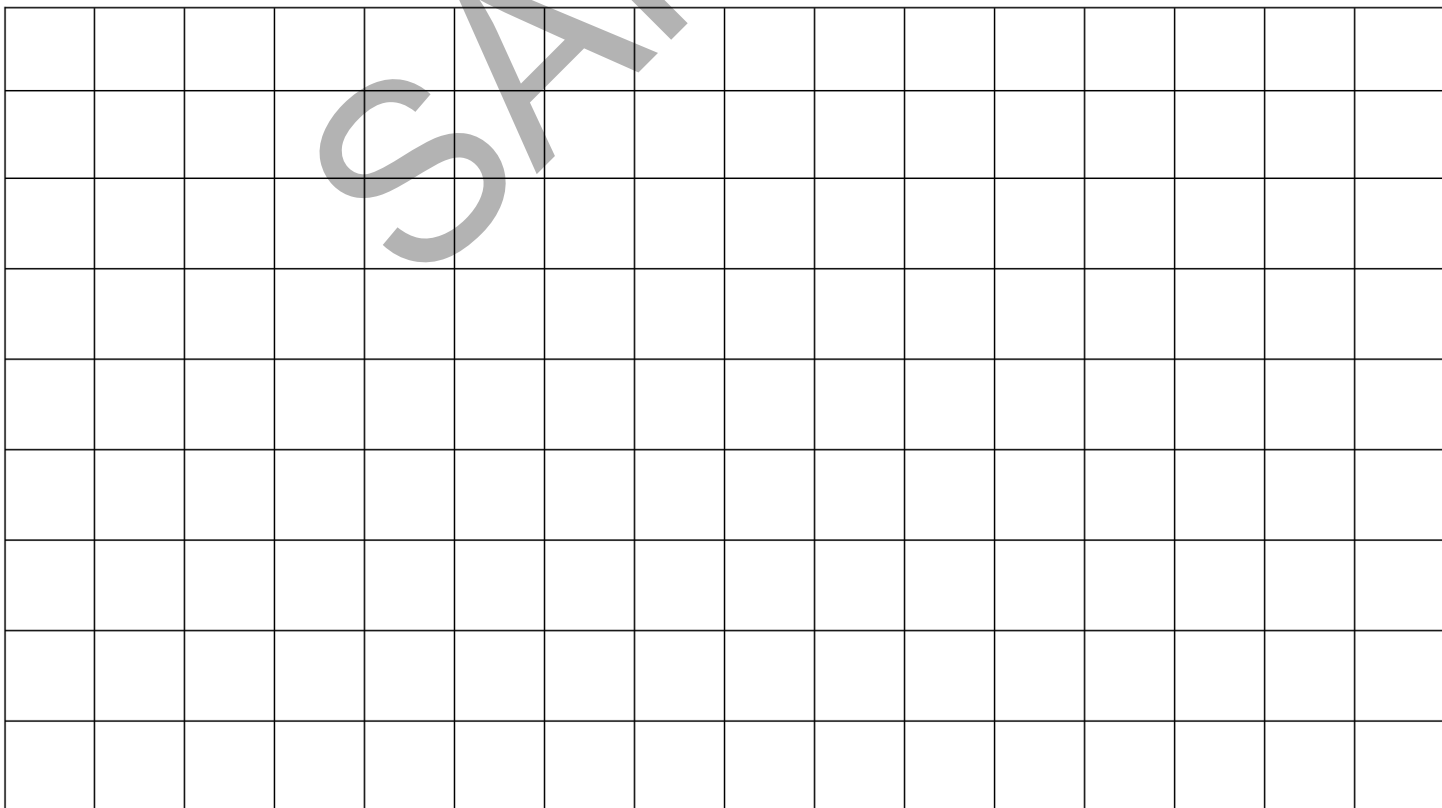
# Chronological Order
